

# Introduction to Lesson 36

Since the first lesson of Fidelis, we've been looking at the metanarrative of Scripture. Hopefully, you have become very familiar with it. In lesson 37 through 50 you're going to find this concept repeated and put into practical use.

As we mentioned in lesson 34, "[Chronological Bible Teaching](#)" may sometimes be referred to as "[Firm Foundations\\*](#)" or "[Chrono](#)". It's a way of talking about how we may summarize and proclaim the big story of Genesis to Jesus, or "[Creation to Christ](#)".

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


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## Resource 1: Dr. Frank Teaches Creation-to-Christ in Taiwan

## Resource 3: God's Narrative: Genesis to Christ by Paul Mac

The **third** resource that you're going to be putting to use is a series of teachings by Paul Mac (Treavor McIlwains's son). This series "*God's Narrative: Genesis to Christ*" will provide a biblical theology and deepen our understanding of the metanarrative of Scripture.

You'll be able to set listen to or watch Paul teach, as well as download written versions of his presentation for FREE. You can save these or print them out for your own personal use. It is very good material.

The primary assignments in this section is to put into practice what you're learning by teaching.

*Starting with lesson 40, (using knowledge from previous lessons and the above resources) you will be required to demonstrate to your cohort leader how you teach 3 summary lessons **based on Genesis 1-12**. This will likely be done through uploading a video recording.*

- 1) Intro to God, God Creates the Cosmos and Humans (Include seen and unseen realm)
  
- 2) Humans Rebel against God, the World is Cursed, Serpent is Cursed, Redeemer Promised
  
- 3) Man continues to sin, God promises Promises to Bless all nations through Abraham's Offspring

The primary aim of this assignment is to help the student develop the **skill of crafting and teaching a story**

- Using one's own speech patterns, or that of the target audience
- Based strictly on the Biblical text
- With the worldview of the target audience in mind
- Summarizing and synthesizing the assigned section
- Showing an the ability to integrate the central theme of the metanarrative of the Scriptures (Christ)
- The video recordings / story-telling sessions must be between 10 and 30 minutes long
- Concept checking questions must be used
